Background information

Cherry Hinton Brook and Coldham's Common are two of Cambridge's hidden chalk stream treasures, rare habitats at the heart of the city.

Together they support specialist wildlife and provide a peaceful escape for people. But these streams are fragile: banks are eroding, gravels are smothered with silt, and pollution pressures are increasing.

We want to protect and restore these special places. By stabilising banks, cleansing gravels, enhancing flows, and creating habitats, we can give sensitive chalk stream species a future while keeping paths safe for people. These works are only a first step. Each site is a case study demonstration project, designed to test practical solutions and gather robust evidence on how urban chalk streams can be made more resilient.

Both sites form part of the Greater Cambridge Chalk Stream Project's network of case studies. Each will be monitored before, during, and after restoration to study water quality, biological communities, and sediment processes. This evidence will guide future restoration across the city and beyond. Local people and volunteers will play an active role, through citizen science monitoring and hands-on restoration activities.

Cherry Hinton Brook

We are consulting on the area from Burnside to Sainsbury's car park.

This shaded stretch, bordered by well-used footpaths, faces several pressures: eroding banks, compacted access points, and silt accumulating in gravels. These changes reduce habitat for aquatic plants and invertebrates.

Our aim is to stabilise eroded banks, improve flow conditions, and restore gravels to support a greater diversity of macrophytes, invertebrates, and fish. The consultation will help us prioritise where

to strengthen banks, improve flows, and create more resilient habitats, ensuring this urban chalk stream remains both ecologically rich and accessible for the community.

Coldham's Common

Coldham's Common is a large green space where streams wind through open grassland and tree belts. Recent eDNA surveys show that brown trout are attempting to enter city streams from the River Cam, and we also have precise data on the water quality parameters needed for their spawning and early life stages. Through this project we are working to understand and demonstrate the full ecological potential of the watercourses in Coldham's Common.

At present, the streams here are under pressure: polluted water enters from urban drains, and fine sediments are settling into gravels that fish and invertebrates depend on. Coldham's Common provides an opportunity to create a demonstration site that trials in-channel works while also testing pollution interception features. Our case study site will gather evidence to inform the design of wider interventions that help intercept pollutants before they reach the stream, while also improving access routes and protecting the wider landscape.

We are inviting views on how people use the Common, where they notice erosion or changes to the streams, and where habitat and access improvements would be most valuable.


