CoFarm Cambridge - Co-farming in Abbey to reduce health inequalities and improve cohesion	Employment of a Farm Manager to deliver: 4 x 3hr open 'co-farming' sessions per week (April - October) with and for the local community. Volunteer co farmers will learn how, and participate in, growing fresh fruit and vegetables sustainably and co create and manage their own community farm and market garden together. Co-farmers will also be involved in harvesting over 10 tonnes of produce for distribution to city residents experiencing food insecurity.
