# How do I sign up?

- Visit <u>Match my project</u> and click the sign-up button on at the top right hand side of the page. You will be asked if you want to sign up as a community organisation or a business. Follow these links to see a step by step guide:

## Who can sign up to use the Cambridge City Council platform?

 Community sector organisations delivering activity in Cambridge City and businesses and supplier who contract with Cambridge City Council

#### What can I ask for?

- Projects can vary in nature enormously, but they must bring 'added value' to the community served by the host organisation, i.e. not be part of core activity. Examples range from:
  - requests to fund particular activities like workshops, sponsorship of uniforms or purchasing specific items and equipment,
  - infrastructure changes such as replacing kitchens, door, painting, electrical upgrades, plumbing, gardening,
  - skills requests such as assistance with marketing, finances or legal advice.
  - requests for volunteers either to carry out particular tasks or with specific skills like being a trustee, digital skills to host workshops,
  - o requests for space to host activities

### Should I sign up with Cambridge City or Cambridgeshire County Council?

You can sign-up to both, to increase visibility across the two platforms. If you
are a community group posting a project, you can log the same project on
both platforms but if you receive a match on one, it is your responsibility to
remove it from the other platform so it doesn't get double-funded.

## Who do I ask for help?/Can I talk to someone about my project?

- For help with projects contact <u>grants@cambridge.gov.uk</u> and a City Council officer will get back to you

#### What projects are allowed/not allowed

 Projects should have a maximum value of £4k, anything higher is very unlikely to receive a match

- Requests must be for activity which brings added value and should not replace core funded activity
- Please also see the terms and conditions on the portal

## Is this the only way we can meet our social value requirements?

 No. Discussion and agreement about your approach to delivering social value should take place with your designated City Council Contract Manager. For example, where the contract is high value, Match my Project is likely to only be a small part of the offering, with the remainder being a more long term commitment spanning the contract term
