## Agenda item 8c. Motion – Our voting system

The Council welcomes the result of the recent general election which delivered a Labour Government for the first time since 2010. However, low turnout remains a persistent issue in national and local government elections with participation reducing again at the most recent City Council elections in May 2024. Political engagement is perceived to be particularly low among those aged under 30 and that the lack of engagement from young people is something which should be of concern for all political parties.

This Council believes that electoral reform can help to improve both engagement and tackle polarisation within our political system and will therefore:

- Ask the Chief Executive to write to the Government asking it to reintroduce proportional voting systems for the elections for Police
  and Crime Commissioners and Directly Elected Mayors during this
  parliament, at the same time expressing regret that the single
  transferrable voting system was removed from these elections in
  the first place.
- Ask the relevant Officers at the City Council to develop a plan, working with partners at the County Council (who passed a similar motion earlier in the year) to encourage greater understanding of the role of the different tiers of local government here in Cambridge, and in particular to bring forward proposals about how

we can work to better engage with younger people in Cambridgeshire to increase participation in local elections.
